United States Government Interest

Please check with your state or local tax office or your tax advisor to determine whether your state allows you to exclude some or all of the income you earn from mutual funds that invest in direct U.S. government obligations. If so, multiply the income percentage listed in the chart below by the amount in Box 1a of your Form 1099-DIV to determine the amount of exempt interest.

SYMMETRY PANORAMIC MUTUAL FUNDS

Federal Tax Treatment – Federal tax law allows dividends from mutual funds investing in municipal obligations to be considered tax exempt income. Any income distribution that qualifies as a tax exempt interest is reported on your Form 1099-DIV, Box 12. You must report this amount on your 2022 Form 1040. The amount reported in Box 13 of Form 1099-DIV must be used in preparing Form 6251 to determine if you are subject to Alternative Minimum Tax. Any income distribution that is taxable income is reported on your Form 1099-DIV, Box 1a. This amount must be reported on Form 1040.

State and Local Tax Treatment – Some of the Federal tax exempt dividends may also be exempt from state and local taxes, depending upon where you file your return. Listed below is the tax exempt percentage of income by state. As state and local tax regulations vary from state to state, not all permit such exclusion. For example, Illinois does not allow a taxpayer to exempt interest paid on Illinois state and local government obligations, if the obligations are held by a shareholder in a mutual fund. Please consult your tax advisor. If the tax law of your state provides for the exemption, multiply the amount in Box 12 of Form 1099-DIV by the appropriate percentage below. This amount can be excluded and the remaining balance should be reported on your state tax return.

Foreign Tax Credit and Foreign Source Income

Symmetry Panoramic Global Fixed Income Fund, Symmetry Panoramic International Equity Fund and Symmetry Panoramic Tax-Managed Global Equity Fund qualified for and elected to pass through foreign tax credits to their shareholders. Accordingly, you are entitled to claim a foreign tax credit or take an itemized deduction on your federal income tax return for your share of the taxes indicated in Box 7 of your 2022 Form 1099-DIV.

To be eligible to claim a foreign tax credit, you must have held your shares for more than 15 days within a 31 day period beginning 15 days before the distribution date.

The maximum credit a taxpayer may use is generally limited to the percentage of U.S. tax that equals the taxpayer's foreign source taxable income as a percentage of worldwide taxable income. If you are unable to use the foreign tax credit, you still may be able to claim the amount as an itemized deduction.

If your total creditable foreign taxes paid are not more than \$300 (\$600 if married filing jointly) and you meet all of the other requirements, you may be eligible to elect to claim a foreign tax credit, without regard to the foreign source income limitation and without filing Form 1116.

If your total creditable foreign taxes paid are more than \$300 (\$600 if married filing jointly), you will be required to compute the foreign source income limitation and complete Form 1116.

To calculate the foreign tax credit limitation, you will need to know your foreign source income and foreign qualifying dividend income from all sources. **Please use the worksheet below to obtain your fund's pertinent information and aggregate it with similar information from other investments you own.**
